Join the Diocese of Providence in celebration as Bishop Tobin ordains Rev. Mr. Derek J. Puleo, Rev. Mr. Adam A. Young and Rev. Mr. Joseph R. Upton to the priesthood on Saturday, June 26, 2010 at the Cathedral of SS. Peter & Paul in Providence.

'No man on his own, relying on his own power, can put another in touch with God. An essential part of the priest's grace is the gift, the task of creating this contact. This is achieved in the proclamation of God's word in which his light comes to meet us. It is achieved in a particularly concentrated manner in the Sacraments. Thus it is Christ himself who makes us holy, that is, who draws us into God's sphere. However, as an act of his infinite mercy, he calls some "to be" with him (cf. Mk 3: 14) and to become, through the Sacrament of Orders, despite their human poverty, sharers in his own priesthood, ministers of this sanctification, stewards of his mysteries, "bridges" to the encounter with him and of his mediation between God and man and between man and God.' The Pastor's Corner

In another week, I will celebrate my 18th anniversary of Priestly Ordination. As I think back, it is unimaginable where the years have gone. So much has changed in those 18 years. The world has changed, the Church has changed and I have changed. How much has been for the good? As for the world, we have come a long way with technology. This is a real good if used for the right purpose, but it can and is also being used for some very grave evils. It seems that morality has sunken to a new low. The dignity of the human person is denied more and more as time goes on.

The Church has had Her own struggles. Everyone knows of the grave scandals that have entangled the Church in the last 18 years. In one sense, I think they are for the good. Of course the sad realities of peoples lives who were harmed was and never will be a good, but God will bring good out of it all! The scandals we have faced should cause all of us to look within and force us to ask ourselves if we are the best Catholic, the best person whom God has created us to be. The scandals are an opportunity for the Church to be purified of indifference, laxity and what we are all about.

I think that I have also grown. There have been struggles and trials, but I know my faith has grown tremendously. Each day I try to conform myself to Christ, to be more like Him to whom I was configured on the day of my ordination. And yes, I have often failed, but those are also opportunities to change and become more of whom I am called to be.

After 18 years of ordination, I would do it all over again. None of us would want to face the trials or sufferings of life again, but they are what makes us the person we are. So, yes! I would willingly give my life to Christ and His Church again, and I do that each day through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
