I have some good news! As you all know, I am probably one of the most technological priests around this area. I do a weekly podcast. For those that don't know, a podcast is an online form of a radio show that people can subscribe to and it automatically downloads to their computer or audio player when a new episode is put out. I'm also very active on a number of online social networks. A social network is a way for people with similar interests to connect and form a kind of online community. My Facebook account now has almost 4000 friends. We also stream all of our Liturgies live over the internet. So if someone is a shut-in, or a relative from a distance who wants to attend a funeral but can't be here in person, or someone just wants to catch a homily, they can do just that at "[www.ipadre.tv](http://www.ipadre.tv)".

Most people know of Apple's revolution with the iPod and the iPhone and now the iPad. Apple has over 100,000 apps available for these media devices. On May 21st, I got my own App that works on the iPod Touch, the iPhone and the iPad. This little app allows someone to listen to all of my podcast episodes, send feedback and call the feedback line.

You may ask, Why all of this online activity? Well, I have always embraced new technology to help spread the Gospel message and the good news of our Catholic Faith. In his address for the 44th Annual World Communications Day, Pope Benedict XVI encouraged priests to take up new technologies to help spread the faith.

Even our Bishop now has his own Facebook Page. Although he is not the most technologically advanced person, Bishop Tobin is encouraging his priests and himself to embrace this new technology for the sake of the Gospel. Be sure to check out the Bishop's Facebook Page and befriend him!
