'The effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost.' (CCC 1302)

Confirmation deepens our "divine filiation", "unites us more firmly to Christ", "increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us", our strengthens our "bond with the Church" and gives us special graces and strength to help us "spread and defend the faith".

What an amazing sacrament! In Confirmation, we are given so many gifts and graces by the Holy Spirit, yet, I think most Catholics take it for granted. Many young people choose not to receive the sacrament of Confirmation and even some parents tell their children that it is their choice. Of course it the individual's choice, but we should encourage our young people to receive such a great gift.

Was there a reason you did not receive the Sacrament of Confirmation? I must tell you that you are missing out on a lot! God has a store hold of graces waiting for you.

If you have not been Confirmed for one reason or another, consider changing that. In October, I will once again begin RCIA classes. RCIA are classes that are specifically geared toward adults who wish to receive a Sacrament they missed, or enter the Catholic Church. Classes meet on Monday evenings (except for holidays).
