The Pastor's Corner

One of the upcoming changes in the new translation of the Roman Missal, will be the most notices and maybe even most difficult. Once we get something in our heads, we become creatures of habit, and long habits often take some time to change. This change revolves around the people's response "And with your spirit" in place of the current "And also with you".

Some people think that this change is just for a more exact translation of the Latin. While it is true that "spirit" is a more exact translation, it is also more accurate. The purpose of this dialogue is not just a casual greeting, "good to see you", "glad you came".

This greeting reminds us of what is truly happening at the Eucharistic Sacrifice. We are not dealing in the realm of the flesh, but of the Spirit. As priest, I greet you, in the fullness of your personhood and invite you to enter into the life of grace. You in turn respond by acknowledging the presence of the Spirit of our Lord in the priest.

The greeting acknowledges that the action taking place is not the action of the person of the priest. The priest acts *in persona Christi* (in the person of Christ). Jesus Christ is acting in and through the minister by virtue of his priestly ordination.

In and of himself, the priest can do nothing to offer the Sacrifice of Christ to the Father on behalf of God's people. Yet, when he as priest acts, it is Christ acting in him.
